The Lolonia family has been growing grapes in Mendocino County since 1920, but it wasn't until 1982 that family members started the Lolonis Winery, Every bottle they produce is made from organically grown grapes (no herbicides, no pesticides). The 1997 Lolonia Redwood Valley Private Reserve Merlot is no exception.

It's made from 100% merlot grapes and tastes like a good merlet should. It's filled with rich fruit flavors, has a rich texture and finishes with a smooth, lingering aftertaste.
